Entity Structure

The Auckland Dragon Boat Association is governed by a Committee under the rules of the Incorporated Society with 3 executives: Chairman, Secretary and Treasurer supported by a Safety Officer, Event Manager, Training Manager, Equipment Manager and other committee members.

The committee meets monthly, with a minimum of 50% of committee required for a quorum. The purpose of the monthly committee meeting is to review the status of Safety, Events, Training, Equipment, Funding, Strategic Partnerships, table any decisions, report risks, issues, hazards, update on outstanding actions.

Main Sources of the Entity's Cash and Resources

Funding comes from membership fees, equipment hire and charity funding.

Main Methods Used by the Entity to Raise Funds

Events/races are the main source of fundraising.

Entity's Reliance on Volunteers and Donated Goods or Services

100% reliance on volunteers to facilitate and run the sport from monthly 2hr committee meetings with 10-12 members who put in 2-10hrs per week each, to 50 (secondary school and adults teams) team managers; coaches, sweeps from September till end of March plus Winter Club Training. Estimated at 11,500 hours per year.

Statement of Accounting Policies

Auckland Dragon Boat Association Incorporated For year ended 30 June 2023

Basis of Preparation

The Auckland Dragon Boat Association Incorporated has elected to apply PBE SFR-A (NFP) Public Entity Simple Format Reporting - Accrual (Not-For-Profit) on the basis that it does not have public accountability and has total annual expenses of equal to or less than \$2,000,000. All transations in the Performance Report are reported using the accrual basis of accounting. The Performance Report is prepared under the assumption that the entity will continue to operate in the foreseeable future.

Good and Services Tax (GST)

All amounts are recorded exclusive of GST, except for Debtors and Creditors which are stated inclusive of GST.

Income Tax

The Auckland Dragon Boat Association Incorporated is exempt from New Zealand income tax having fully complied with all statutory conditions for these exemptions.

Bank Accounts and Cash

Bank accounts and cash in the Statement of Cash Flows comprise of cash balances and bank balances (including short term deposits) with original maturities of 90 days or less.

Property, Plant and Equipment

Items of property, plant and equipment are stated at cost, less accumulated depreciation and any impairment losses, on a straight line basis.

Depreciation is calculated using the following estimated useful lives: Dragon boats, IRB boats, trailers, engines = 4-5 years, Paddles, oars & life jackets = 2 years and other misc items = 2-3 years. For items bought second hand the age at that time is deducted from the above useful life.

Revenue

Membership subscription income is recognised as income in the year to which it relates. Event income is recognised as income at the time of the event.

Changes in Accounting Policies

There have been no changes in accounting policies during the financial year (last year - nil).

The last financial year has been more stable than the previous year with 5 events being offered in full, although 2 were cancelled due to bad weather and 1 event terminated mid-way. We were fortunate to have the February camp take place although it ended early due to incoming bad weather. Instead of lock-downs disrupting training and events the past year has mainly been affected by disruptive weather, affecting both events and the safe paddling environment within the Basin.

William Buck has again been engaged to perform the annual audit, at a cost of \$1,900 + GST & disbursements.

One member kindly gave a donation of \$1,000 to the day to day expenses of running the club which was very much appreciated.

Opinions

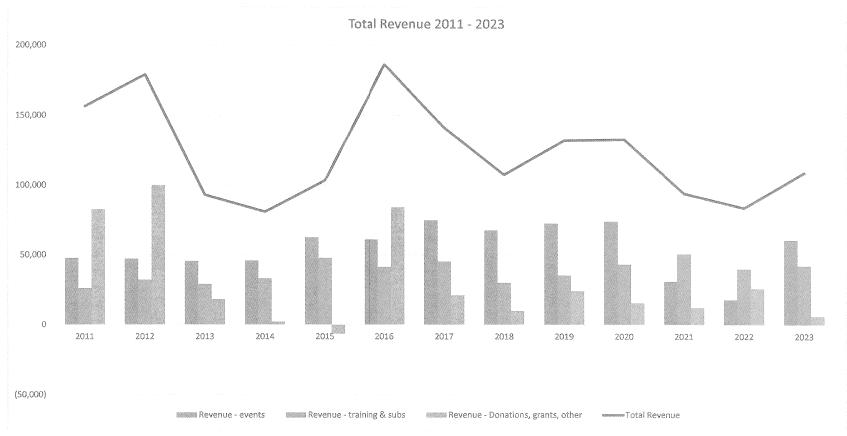
